I AM A SINNER. In today's Scripture readings the prophet Isaiah, the apostle Paul, and the apostle Peter each acknowledges that he is a sinner: 'I am a man of unclean lips,' cries Isaiah; 'I persecuted the Church of God,' confesses Paul; 'I am a sinful man,' says Peter. They know their need of forgiveness but they are also aware of the power of God at work in them. We too are sinners, but if we have faith in the grace of God working within us, we can be great missionaries as well.

The fishermen had gone out of them and were washing their nets. He got into one of the boats – it was Simon's – and asked him to put out a little from the shore. Then he sat down and taught the crowds from the boat.

When he had finished speaking he said to Simon, 'Put out into deep water and pay out your nets for a catch.' 'Master,' Simon replied, 'we worked hard all night long and caught nothing, but if you say so, I will pay out the nets.' And when they had done this they netted such a huge number of fish that their nets began to tear, so they signalled to their companions in the other boats to come and help them; when these came, they filled the two boats to sinking point.

When Simon Peter saw this he fell at the knees of Jesus saying, 'Leave me, Lord; I am a sinful man.' For he and all his companions were completely overcome by the catch they had made; so also were James and John, sons of Zebedee, who were Simon's partners. But Jesus said to Simon, 'Do not be afraid; from now on it is men you will catch.' Then, bringing their boats back to land, they left everything and followed him.

BREAKING OPEN THE WORD

APOSTLES OF THE LORD

All the readings for today share a sense of awe and wonder as Isaiah, Peter, and Paul reflect on their respective vocations. In their own ways, each of them has to come to terms with their unworthiness to undertake the mission they have been given. Having seen the living God in a vision, Isaiah knew he was unworthy. However, once he had been purified, he was able to respond willingly and generously to God's call. In the face of the miraculous catch of fish, Peter pleads with the Lord that he would depart from him. He knows he is a sinner and yet the Lord will make use of him as one who will be catching people for the kingdom of God. Paul understood that of all the people who bore the name apostle, he was the most unworthy. He makes mention of his persecution of Christians before his conversion in 1 Corinthians 15:9, Galatians 1:13,23, and Philippians 3:6. The damage that he had inflicted was to become a powerful stimulus for his tireless missionary endeavours. In today's reading, Paul reminds the Corinthians of the message they had received concerning the resurrection by drawing upon one of the earliest creeds. Some of the members of the community had mistakenly come to think that they already shared fully in the life of the resurrection. Their baptism had immersed them in the mystery of the death and resurrection of Jesus Christ, but Paul knew that Christians would need to wait until Jesus' return to experience this fully.

Words from Fr Charles:

Parish Pastoral Councils: the Parish Pastoral Councils for both St Gregory the Great and St Kevin's parishes met together face to face for the first time. The gathering was successful, cooperative, co-responsible: so far so that we agreed to hold a joint meeting regularly about once a guarter. The two major discussion areas were Holy Week services (see below) and the future of our parishes: the dreams/directions/visions/possibilities/enriching of the past and present/changing so that we can also grow as disciples who go out and make disciples. We didn't set down detailed plans: that will come and Alfred and I will start looking at some details. What we did do was start to find our areas of commonality, and strengths, and desire for our parishes.

A clear desire for both parishes is to rejuvenate after Covid-19 – to continue to reawaken as a community and revisit / review / strengthen our existing ways of being parish and along with that seek out ways for growth.

The Holy Spirit is indeed strong among us!

Lent/Easter Services: One of the major discussions at our joint Pastoral Council meeting this past week was how best I can be present across both St Gregory's and St Kevin's for the Ash Wednesday and Holy Week services that are needed. We were able to arrive at an agreed balance that enables my presence at all the major ceremonies for both parishes. Most results were obvious but what was remarkable was that where there was discussion the outcome reached brought in thoughts none of us had formed at the start of the discussion: at a local level, in a small way, that is called a synodal discussion. Congratulations to all involved and thank you. We will publish the Lent/Easter ceremonies as we get nearer to Ash Wednesday.

I am about to order books for our Lenten Discussions so get started organising yourselves so you can start up your group or form a new one - there will be signup sheets I am sure. In person and via videoconference are both feasible and acceptable (and have worked well).
