
SECOND READING

We can be sure that we love God's children if we love God himself and do what he has commanded us; this is what loving God is – keeping his commandments; and his commandments are not difficult, because anyone who has been begotten by God has already overcome the world; this is the victory over the world – our faith. Only the man who believes that Jesus is the Son of God; Jesus Christ who came by water and blood, not with water only, but with water and blood; with the Spirit as another witness – since the Spirit is the truth.

In the evening of that same day, the first day of the week, the doors were closed in the room where the disciples were, for fear of the Jews. Jesus came and stood among them. He said to them, 'Peace be with you,' and showed them his hands and his side. The disciples were filled with joy when they saw the Lord, and he said to them again, 'Peace be with you.

'As the Father sent me, so am I sending you,'

After saying this he breathed on them and said:

'Receive the Holy Spirit.

For those whose sins you forgive,

they are forgiven; for those whose sins you retain, they are retained.'

Thomas, called the Twin, who was one of the Twelve, was not with them when Jesus came. When the disciples said, 'We have seen the Lord,' he answered, 'Unless I see the holes that the nails made in his hands and can put my finger into the holes they made, and unless I can put my hand into his side, I refuse to believe.' Eight days later the disciples were in the house again and Thomas was with them. The doors were closed, but Jesus came in and stood among them, 'Peace be with vou,' he said. Then he spoke to Thomas, 'Put your finger here; look, here are my hands. Give me your hand; put it into my side. Doubt no longer but believe.' Thomas replied, 'My Lord and my God!' Jesus said to him;

'You believe because you can see me. Happy are those who have not seen and yet believe.'

There were many other signs that Jesus worked and the disciples saw, but they are not recorded in this book. These are recorded so that you may believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God, and that believing this you may have life through his name.

BREAKING OPEN THE WORD

RADICAL TRANSFORMATION

As we bask in the light of resurrection, today we see two witnesses to the resurrection, and the transformation of lives.

The first reading is from the Acts of the Apostles, the second volume attributed to Luke, and it presents to us a changed way of living. Firstly, the whole group of believers are described as 'of one heart and soul' (v. 32). The apostles appear as testifying with great power to the resurrection and 'great grace was upon them all' (v. 33). The remarkable addition here is that they shared everything in common, sold property and distributed funds so no-one was in need (v. 34-35). This radical transformation of their way of life is not a defining feature of our communities today, even though adopted by many religious congregations throughout the Church's history. While not diminishing the great charitable works operating today, this way of life remains a challenge to us in a world where rich become richer and poor increase in number and poverty.

In juxtaposition to the Acts account, the Gospel outlines the appearance of Jesus among the apostles and the repetition of 'Peace be with you' (vv.19, 21). In this gathering behind closed doors, Jesus tells the apostles that he is sending them out. He breathes the Holy Spirit upon them, commissioning them. Eight days later in the same room Jesus arrives saying once again 'Peace be with you' (v. 26) and here is the experience of the doubting Thomas, forever recorded for anyone who might doubt that the resurrection happened and is real.

How will our lives be transformed by the resurrection?

Thoughts from your Parish Priest,

Did you get caught by April 1? April Fools Day? I was slightly caught by an article about the 25m high monolith in St Peter's Square being removed, unseen, overnight.

Did you miss "Fall Forward" this weekend? Advance your clock by an hour at the end of Daylight Saving for 2024? Most of my clocks, and particularly my alarm clock, advance automatically these days so my alarm goes off on time. But ... it's easy to look at one of the analogue clocks after I get up and ... almost got caught.

Did you miss Easter? It seems some people did. I visited the Aboriginal Community Elders Service to lead a prayer service on Wednesday and met a lovely lady leaning on her gate holding two homegrown cucumbers. We said hi. I said Happy Easter! And ... she said that's over and done with. No, I said, we've got 40-something days to go till the end of the season. Ah, she said—you must be a pastor of some sort ... (and then we talked some more). We know of course that The Resurrection is every day and we celebrate the whole Easter Triduum every time we celebrate the Mass. Christ Jesus is always with us. This special season merely helps us to know that more and more deeply every year.

Thank you to ... everyone who helped bring about Holy Week this year. I've been totting it up very roughly and there were about 75 people at St Kevin's and over 150 at St Greg's who helped make Holy Week run so beautifully and sacredly and joyfully. From working bee to church cleaning and flowers and choir and readers and lectors and altar servers, and liturgy people and ... so on and on: yes—it takes a lot of work to ensure that we present a meaningful moment of spiritual growth with the journey from Triumphal Entry into Jerusalem through death and into Resurrection. And the journey continues: Ascension and Pentecost are just a few weeks away. And thank you to those of you who participated with your presence, your prayer, your singing, your being part of the community.

On another topic. Volunteering for the parish, if you don't already. What holds you back? Why can't you provide some of your time and talent? We have many volunteers but nowhere near enough. We need more of you to help. What is holding you back—or more importantly how could I, how could the parish, help enable you to be willing and able to offer your time and talent? To give a little more so you can help us all to spread the Good News even more effectively.

PS: a joint submission from St Greg's and St Kevin's about being synodal is almost ready for final approval by Parish Pastoral Councils. I will share this with everyone once it is finalised and has been submitted. It is amazing to see the ways in which we are already working in a synodal: working in a way which shares responsibility for our faith life between myself and the whole parish.
