JOY COMES WITH THE DAWN. The disciples of Jesus went through the blackest of nights on the Sea of Tiberias. They were weighed down by grief and shock at the death of Jesus, and guilt for denying him in the case of Peter. And they caught no fish. But joy came with the dawn when the risen Christ appeared to them. They caught many fish, shared a meal with him and Peter experienced forgiveness. The risen Christ comes to us in this Eucharist bringing nourishment, forgiveness and light.

We are witnesses of these words, and so is the Holy Spirit.


The high priest demanded an explanation of the apostles. 'We gave you a formal warning,' he said 'not to preach in this name, and what have you done? You have filled Jerusalem with your teaching, and seem determined to fix the guilt of this man's death on us.' In reply Peter and the apostles said, 'Obedience to God comes before obedience to men; it was the God of our ancestors who raised up Jesus, but it was you who had him executed by hanging on a tree. By his own right hand God has now raised him up to be leader and saviour, to give repentance and forgiveness of sins through him to Israel. We are witnesses to all this, we and the Holy Spirit whom God has given to those who obey him.' They warned the apostles not to speak in the name of Jesus and released them. And so they left the presence of the Sanhedrin glad to have had the honour of suffering humiliation for the sake of the name.

Jesus stepped forward, took the bread and gave in to them, and did the same with the fish.

Jesus showed himself again to the disciples. It was by the Sea of Tiberias, and it happened like this: Simon Peter, Thomas called the Twin, Nathanael from Cana in Galilee, the sons of Zebedee and two more of his disciples were together. Simon Peter said, 'I'm going fishing.' They replied, 'We'll come with you.' They went out and got into the boat but caught nothing that night.

It was light by now and there stood Jesus on the shore, though the disciples did not realise that it was Jesus. Jesus called out, 'Have you caught anything, friends?' And when they answered, 'No', he said, 'Throw the net out to starboard and you'll find something.' So they dropped the net, and there were so many fish that they could not haul it in. The disciple Jesus loved said to Peter, 'It is the Lord.' At these words 'It is the Lord', Simon Peter, who had practically nothing on, wrapped his cloak round him and jumped into the water. The other disciples came on in the boat, towing the net and the fish; they were only about a hundred yards from land.

As soon as they came ashore they saw that there was some bread there, and a charcoal fire with fish cooking on it. Jesus said, 'Bring some of the fish you have just caught.' Simon Peter went aboard and dragged the net to the shore, full of big fish, one hundred and fifty-three of them; and in spite of there being so many the net was not broken. Jesus said to them, 'Come and have breakfast.' None of the disciples was bold enough to ask, 'Who are you?'; they knew quite well it was the Lord. Jesus then stepped forward, took the bread and gave it to them, and the same with the fish. This was the third time that Jesus showed himself to the disciples after rising from the dead.

#### **BREAKING OPEN THE WORD**

#### THE CALL TO NEW LIFE

If the story of Israel and the life, death, and resurrection of Jesus teach us anything it is that God always seeks us out in our weakness. God's untiring love and mercy enable us to begin anew, to start again, to dare to believe that we too might come to share in the peace and joy of the resurrection.

In the first reading from Acts, the Jewish authorities are unsettled and disconcerted by the ministry of the apostles and their message. In their fear and rage, they seek to stop them. While they focus on the fact that they are being held responsible for the death of Jesus they fail to hear that they are being called to a new beginning through repentance by changing their minds about Jesus' identity and mission. Despite Jesus' brutal death, forgiveness of sins is possible, a door is open for them if they can take hold of the opportunity. Unfortunately, their fear blinds them and their response is a misguided attempt to discipline and control the apostles and their ministry.

In the Gospel, Peter, who knew the reality of failure and weakness in his life, does not make the same mistake. When he recognises the Lord, he seizes the opportunity. He may have denied Jesus before his death but he will not make the same mistake again. The three questions of the risen Lord painfully call him to come to acknowledge his three denials. Jesus accepts what he can give and calls him to accept a new responsibility for the flock; a new chapter in his life is about to begin.

## Words from Fr Charles:

#### Safeguarding Our Children

On Wednesday evening I sat with Margaret, Gianna, Lee, Viviana and Marcello (with Michelle and Stephanie in our thoughts in their absence) from St Greg's and with Rebecca and others from St Kevin's (again in their absence) working through our next steps in seeking to further our plans to implement a conscious culture of caring for children and young people.

I was reminded of a management course I did in about 1982 in the middle of winter up in Olinda—almost as cold as growing up in Canberra. One small element of the course focussed on competence. Continuous improvement involves recognising an issue that needs improvement, then implementing ways in which we can progress from unconscious incompetence, to conscious incompetence, to conscious competence, to unconscious competence. At the end we are able to deal with that issue almost automatically and then we can move on to identify the next issue of concern and the improvement that is needed.

As "The Catholic Church" we know that historically we, the broad church, have failed our young people abysmally in the abuse that happened. Indeed, I know of people within our parishes who have personally been affected.

We also know that we ardently want to improve in ourselves so that indivisual and collective failure never occurs again.

The meeting on Wednesday started laying out plans for:

- How we can undertake risk assessment and mitigation in a practical way with all groups.
- How we can help educate each other about safeguarding childen and young people (we want to keep everyone safe but are starting with the most vulnerable).
- How we can broaden the capacity we have to do these things by sharing the effort between St Greg's and St Kevin's.
- Asking all volunteers to once again sign a code of conduct.

I thought I knew all I needed about keeping children safe: I raised two sons and I am a bit clever. I am learning new things each time we progress more deeply into this process of Safeguarding our Children. Please, be open to journeying with me and the committee as we progress.

#### Seminarian:

Starting in the near future, we will have the pleasure and grace to have Tuong Nguyen, a fourth year seminarian, living with us for the rest of the year, through till about Christmas. Tuong will be learning about living parish life, expanding his experience of parish ministry and pastoral work, and continuing to discern his vocation. In addition, we will have extra hands to help us in invigorating our parish.

I have accepted the request to house and guide seminarians every time there has been a request (four so far in six years) because it is only amongst you that the vocation to be a diocesan priest can be fully discerned. Our responsibility is significant, we are up to it because Jesus Christ and the Holy Spirit are truly present with us.
