
FINDING OUR TREASURE

As a young king, Solomon knew that he had much to learn to be the ruler the people of Israel needed him to be. When God invited him to ask for whatever he needed he asked for the gift of discernment between good and evil. Wealth might come and go, but the treasure he needed most of all was the gift of wisdom

Matthewconcludes the parabolic discourse with four parables that emphasise the wisdom that is required to not only recognise what is of lasting value but to hold on to it when we find it. It can be that what is of value is often hidden like the treasure in the field, or needs to be discovered like the pearl, or sorted like the catch that the dragnet brings in. While Jesus spoke of the treasure of the kingdom of God, Matthew has come to see that the pearl of great price is Jesus himself who is the source of our hope and the wisdom we need to live life to the full. Throughout the eighth chapter of the letter to the Romans, Paul encourages his readers to take heart during the struggles and difficulties that they face as Christians. Our faith itself is a pearl of great price, a gift and treasure that gives us the strength to deal with the struggles and complexities of our lives. God can transform even the darkest moments and our faith helps us to live with hope in the future glory God has prepared for us.

From the desk of the PP ...

Caritas / Thanksgiving receipts for FY 2023: sorry for the delay!! The (unavoidable) change of software systems has led to ongoing complications that we did not anticipate which means a delay in providing Thanksgiving Receipts and the associated Caritas receipts.

They are coming. The data is all entered and we now know how to generate each receipt. A change will be that the Caritas receipt will come from Caritas (not via us) so we aren't sure how that process will play out.

Thank you for your patience as we struggle with learning and adapting to new computer systems.

Gates/Seniors Parking: we are on the home stretch. The gates are practically operational. The computer systems and links are all working. We just need to finalise the connections between the physical gates and the IT, and do some final setting up – and then we will make the gates operational.

We will be closing the two seniors parking spaces and creating two new ones down the slope towards the car-park and at the same time we will adjust the two seniors spaces on the school side of the drive and create two new general spaces where currently we have 'no parking' along the kerb. The 'accessibility' spaces in the middle will remain and the ability to make a u-turn will remain.

Multi-cultural Festival:

It will be a wonderful day indeed!

It looks as though our joint St Greg's / St Kevin's multicultural festival this Sunday is set to be a great success. The number of people who have indicated they are comings, from both parishes, is most encouraging. The range of gifts donated for silent auctions is amazing. We have our children lined up to help with the Mass and to present in the hall. Our school children and parishioners have provided Prayers of the Faithful in various languages. It will be a marvellous demonstration of our one-ness in Jesus Christ and our diversity and difference in culture, ethnicity, social group, geographic origin.

My background contains a lot of English, some Scottish and some German. But ... in practice I am Australian – this is the place that feels like home for me. I love my origins but here is 'right' for me. I was asked once, by an Aboriginal person "what is your country?" After pondering I decided that the question was actually about belonging to, being part of the Land, in that deep Aboriginal sense. As near as I can tell, after some thought and discussion I had to say – my place, my land in that sense, is Jesus Christ. Which intrigues me. I like it. But it seems different from how my Aboriginal friends experience 'place.'

Enjoy the day. Enjoy relishing the diversity and difference amidst our oneness in Christ.

Planning for the Future:

My support group met with Parish Pastoral and Finance Councils from both parishes, with the three School principals present. We discussed a proposal for how to enable our parishes to focus on outreach and mission more effectively. The proposal was received positively with many questions and suggestions. The proposal helps give more focus for existing roles and includes the potential to employ some more people to help provide the effort needed to be intentional, conscious and deliberate, in how we enact our mission to be among the people helping, and at the same time inviting people to come to meet and get to know Jesus.


