
SECOND READING

BREAKING OPEN THE WORD

VICTORY DEARLY-WON

While the idea of the monarchy may be a difficult and controversial one in contemporary Australia, today's feast calls us to reflect on the paradoxical kingship of Christ. We are invited to ponder with awe and gratitude a kingship unlike any other. In the ancient world, people such as Alexander the Great and Julius Caesar became kings or emperors as a result of their military exploits. David was acclaimed king by the tribes of Israel precisely on that basis. His military prowess was seen to be a sign of God's blessing upon him and his descendants.

When we reflect on the kingship of Jesus it is patently clear that Jesus' exploits and prowess are of another kind. His battles were against sin, suffering and death. His victory was dearly won and his enthronement took place on a rocky outcrop called Calvary, surrounded by misunderstanding, ridicule, rejection and calls to exercise his kingship by saving himself. Both the early Christian hymn of Colossians and Luke's passion narrative bear eloquent testimony to a kingship based on service and self-giving love.

In the hymn from Colossians, we witness the outpouring of the faith of the early Church as it praised Jesus as Lord of creation, head of the Church, and firstborn from the dead. However, they did not lose sight of the fact that it was on the cross that victory had been won, wounds healed and all creation reconciled with God.

A few thoughts from the desk of the PP:

Archbishop Peter has issued a letter titled "Welcome Home" (copies available in the Narthex). We are once again obliged to attend Mass each Sunday and Holy Day of Obligation. At the start of the Covid-19 pandemic, he provided us all a dispensation from this Obligation (though we still desired to attend). This dispensation has been ended from the 1st Sunday of Advent. In lifting this dispensation Archbishop Peter comments "the ordinary individual exemptions will remain in place (e.g. for reasons of ill health, family care of the vulnerable, etc.). So, as has always been the case, you must take proper consideration of your personal circumstances when deciding to participate in our gathering for Mass. Whilst gathering for Mass is a vital element of living our being as Catholics, our desire and obligation to attend Mass must not be at risk to our health or the health of others.

From this weekend, I am no longer going to live-stream Masses. Our full return to Mass, the rapid decline in numbers viewing live-streamed Masses, an extensive discussion among the Safeguarding Committee about the risks of having our children visible on line, and ongoing technical difficulties with live-streaming mean that the need for making Mass available no longer outweigh the risks associated. If this change causes you any issues, please contact the office (phone, email)./

Another decision that arose from our Safeguarding Committee meeting is to prohibit photography during Masses due to the risks associated with children being visible on social media. If there are baptisms or people receiving sacraments then photographs can be taken after Mass instead of during. This emphasises the importance and solemnity of the Mass and at the same time helps us to develop and embed our culture of conscious care for and safe-guarding of our children and other vulnerable people.

ADVENT / CHRISTMAS!!!!

Wow—this weekend we celebrate the Feast of Christ the King and next week Advent begins and we enter a new liturgical year: Year A, a year focussing through the Gospel of Matthew.

We have settled on the schedule of Masses for Christmas—the schedule is up on the notice board. On December 15th at St Kevin's Church, there will be a Joint Parishes Rite of Reconciliation, with personal, individual, absolution available after the body of the service. We will start the service at 7:00 pm (there is plenty of parking behind St Kevin's Church as well as along the road, and you can drop off those with mobility constraints at the front door before parking).

This week, we wend through the final week of "Ordinary" time of the liturgical year, beginning with the Feast of Christ the King (the king who dies ignominiously through crucifixion). Let us allow this contradiction to rest with us: a King and such a lowly, terrible death—and that leads to our salvation, and a world that grows in goodness (slowly, imperfectly). Perhaps ... in our weakness and in our times of great difficulty, the opportunity for us to bear witness to God's great love is most evident.
