A reading from the Acts of the Apostles God has made Jesus both Lord and Christ.

On the day of Pentecost Peter stood up with the Eleven and addressed the crowd with a loud voice: 'The whole House of Israel can be certain that God has made this Jesus whom you crucified both Lord and Christ.'


Hearing this, they were cut to the heart and said to Peter and the apostles, 'What must we do, brothers?' 'You must repent,' Peter answered 'and every one of you must be baptised in the name of Jesus Christ for the forgiveness of sins, and you will receive the gift of the Holy Spirit. The promise that was made is for you and your children, and for all those who are far away, for all those whom the Lord our God will call to himself.' He spoke to them for a long time using many arguments, and he urged them, 'Save yourselves from this perverse generation.' They were convinced by his arguments, and they accepted what he said and were baptised. That very day about three thousand were added to their number.'

A reading from the first letter of St Peter You had gone astray but now you have come back to the shepherd and guardian of your souls. The merit, in the sight of God, is in bearing punishment patiently when you are punished after doing your duty.

This, in fact, is what you are called to do, because Christ suffered for you and left an example for you to follow the way he took. He had not done anything wrong, and there had been no perjury in his mouth. He was insulted and did not retaliate with insults; when he was tortured he made no threats but he put his trust in the righteous judge. He was bearing our faults in his own body on the cross, so that we might die to our faults and live for holiness; through his wounds you have been healed. You had gone astray like sheep but now you have come back to the shepherd and guardian of your souls.

BREAKING OPEN THE WORD

FULLNESS OF LIFE

The readings for today invite us to reflect on the death and resurrection of Jesus and its consequences for us. As Peter concludes his preaching on the day of Pentecost, he reminds the pilgrims gathered in Jerusalem that Jesus' brutal and wrongful death has been reversed by God raising him as Lord and Christ. That is not all, because the resurrection provides them with the possibility to think again and so accept the gracious forgiveness that God is unexpectedly offering. In the midst of human frailty, misunderstanding and violence God's love will find a way to bring life out of death.

In the second reading the focus shifts as Peter pays close attention to Jesus' manner of dealing with his own suffering and death as a model for disciples as we confront suffering and injustice. As the shepherd, Jesus goes before us carrying our weakness and brokenness on the cross transforming them by the power of his healing love. In our turn, we are called to follow his example of forgiving and lifegiving love.

The Gospel today invites us to accept Jesus as the Good Shepherd who calls, protects, and enlivens us. Jesus is the Shepherd who gave himself for the sake of the sheep, the one who still calls us to hear his voice and follow. He has come so we might have life and have it to the full. In Jesus, we have the sure hope that whatever struggles lie before us he will lead us safely home if we listen to his voice and follow where he leads.

I have no idea what I will have seen and done beyond attending a two day conference in Rochester, Minnesota and having spend nearly two days in aeroplanes.

When I plan my holidays I rely on my friends and family to point me to good things to do at the 'other end' – during the time I spend with them. Partly that is because it allows them to show off what is important in the places they live. Partly because I don't make the time to trawl through travel books to find the things that really attract me. Partly because what I most want is to spend time with friends and family – the things and places of the world are often beautiful and awe inspiring but the truly great evidences of God's work in my life lie in the people I meet and the family and friends I spent time with. On my last trip, back in 2019, on my way home my flight took me through Los Angeles and there was a long queue waiting to get through security. One guard had the most delightful laugh and joking way of moving us along "just move ahead here, keep the line going," ah, sonny tie your shoe lace but tie it loosely because you'll need to take your shoes off, ah, no no, we don't wear hats inside the lighting isn't bright enough to see with anyway so wearing a hat means we can't see your beautiful smiles and so on – what could have been a difficult 40 minutes was delightful: graced, stress was lowered, the people who needed special checks were identified with a minimum of fuss and they were happy being checked.

Finding evidence of God's love – my life's work I suppose, my gift perhaps (I don't think I have personally met a person in whom I couldn't see goodness and joy that comes from God).

Hopefully I will come back to parish life full of the energy of the Holy Spirit, charged with the love that can be found in the odd places of the world.

The 45 people who registered for the recent Joint St Kevin's & St Gregory's Parishes 'Indigenous Voice & issues' online Forum on 12th April, and the 9 who joined a related excursion on April 20th to the Aboriginal Catholic Ministry in Thornbury were pleased not only to HEAR ABOUT The Voice but helpfully HEAR FROM a Voice 1st hand. We also learned about a very successful programme supported by the Aboriginal Catholic Ministry to help provide Koori Kids who otherwise couldn't afford an education of their choice. Hearing first hand case studies highlighted both the importance and effectiveness of such encouragement and education for Koori Kids, both for their personal development and the wider benefit to society. The one hour Forum and its Q & A were recorded and anyone interested can request a link to the video from the Parish Office or St Kevin's Social Justice Action. Our 2nd Collection today in parallel with the St Kevin's campaign will help support the highly successful and important work of the Opening Doors Foundation. 
