

BREAKING OPEN THE WORD

INCREASE OUR FAITH

On the journey of faith there are moments when we may lose heart or be discouraged. Faced with opposition or misunderstanding it is no easy matter to maintain our trust in the Lord. At times the responsibilities of our Christian lives may be experienced as a burden. Like the first disciples, we find ourselves turning to Jesus saying, 'increase our faith!'

When we look around us there is so much suffering caused by injustice and our violence to one another. It is only natural that we question how God's plans will come to fruition when they clash head-on with human weakness. Habakkuk found himself dealing with many of the same issues. His time was one of violence and his hope and faith in God's power and the realisation of God's plans was flagging. Habakkuk is reminded in a vision that while the wheels move slowly, they are moving nonetheless, and God's purposes will come to pass for the upright who remain faithful.

In the second letter to him, Timothy is also called not to lose heart and remain faithful to his responsibilities as a young pastor. Having been commissioned and called to this ministry he may have been discouraged by its demands and complexity. The sound advice that is given is to remember there is no need to rely solely on his own resources. The precious gift of the Spirit has been given. In the ministry of leadership, it is the Spirit that will guide, empower and strengthen – there is no need to fear.

Words from ... the PP's Keyboard:

I found myself in what was for me an unusual situation last weekend: I had carefully prepared my homily and it seemed to make sense when I finished it. But!!!! When I presented it at St Kevin's, it fell apart, twice (to the 5:30 pm / 10 am congregations my apologies). Then: I got focus, I think it became Ok.

I mention this because it reminds me of an important point: it is easy to make mistakes; easy to focus on 'me and what I want to say' and forget to allow the Holy Spirit space. That is what happened: I squeezed in three ideas that "I" wanted to speak about—the Holv Spirit wanted only ONE idea included. We all need to make space for the Holy Spirit—and recognize his call.


Bishop Hilton Deakin died on 28th September. Bishop Hilton played a significant role in my life and vocational call from 2004 to 2013 and occasionally since. A man, priest, bishop of great insight, passion who love Jesus Christ before all and through Christ loved the marginalized: Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander, Timor Leste, Timor Oeste, I grieve at his death.

On a more positive note: I am about to start a series of 'leadership coaching' sessions with Ron Huntley and four parishioners have agreed to journey with me (Alfred Ablaza and Margaret O'Donnell from St Greg's and Tiziana D'Costa and Carmel Purdey from St Kevin's). They will be a support group for me, helping me to lead our parishes towards ways for the strength of faith that we already to be deepened and so that we can flourish in seeking to spread the Good News. I am not supplanting the parish councils or finance groups or any other groups but seeking to have help so we can all greater insight into how to be even better followers, disciples, of Christ.

And ... I have had meetings with the finance groups in both parishes and am pleased to say that we are in good financial health: THANK YOU, indeed, I do thank you greatly. Yes, there has been some loss of Thanksgiving income but we don't see this as the right time for a Stewardship/Thanksgiving campaign. I would however, gently ask that you to review your pledge and see if it remains current and appropriate for you today.

And finally: As we seek to get current volunteers up-to-date with Working With Children Check and Code of Conduct it also true that we need more people to step in and help with all aspects of parish life. Please look inside your heart. feel inside your soul: are you giving of your time and talent in ways which can help the parish flourish? Thank you for looking come and see me.


