KEEP AWAKE TILL HE COMES. The early Christians applied this teaching of Jesus to their expectation of his second coming. More generally speaking, today's Gospel parables should encourage us to be morally vigilant at all times and ever ready to encounter, in the midst of daily life, the 'God of surprises'. Paul has similar advice for us: 'Keep alert, stand firm in your faith' (1 Cor 16:13).



SECOND READING

Heb 11:1-2, 8-19

A reading from the letter to the Hebrews We will look for the city designed and built by God.

Only faith can guarantee the blessings that we hope for, or prove the existence of the realities that at present remain unseen. It was for faith that our ancestors were commended.

It was by faith that Abraham obeyed the call to set out for a country that was the inheritance given to him and his descendants, and that he set out without knowing where he was going. By faith he arrived, as a foreigner, in the Promised Land, and lived there as if in a strange country, with Isaac and Jacob, who were heirs with him of the same promise. They lived there in tents while he looked forward to a city founded, designed and built by God.

It was equally by faith that Sarah, in spite of being past the age, was made able to conceive, because she believed that he who had made the promise would be faithful to it. Because of this, there came from one man, and one who was already as good as dead himself, more descendants than could be counted, as many as the stars of heaven or the grains of sand on the seashore.

All these died in faith, before receiving any of the things that had been promised, but they saw them in the far distance and welcomed them, recognising that they were only strangers and nomads on earth. People who use such terms about themselves make it quite plain that they are in search of their real homeland. They can hardly have meant the country they came from, since they had the opportunity to go back to it; but in fact they were longing for a better homeland, their heavenly homeland. That is why God is not ashamed to be called their God, since he has founded the city for them.

It was by faith that Abraham, when put to the test, offered up Isaac. He offered to sacrifice his only son even though the promises had been made to him and he had been told: it is through Isaac that your name will be carried on. He was confident that God had the power even to raise the dead; and so, figuratively speaking, he was given back Isaac from the dead.

BREAKING OPEN THE WORD

A TWO-EDGED SWORD

The word of the Lord is said to be a two-edged sword (Hebrews 4:12) and so it is with the readings for today encouragement and warning stand side by side. Both the passage from the book of Wisdom and that from Hebrews, invite us to see our journey of faith in a positive light. The examples of Abraham and Sarah, as well as the people of the Exodus, show us that others too have had to trust in God's promises when the way forward has not been clear. The most vivid instance of this is when Abraham was called to sacrifice his only son Isaac. One can only try to imagine his distress when called to sacrifice the very one by whom God's promises were to be accomplished. Despite revulsion and fear he still took the leap of faith, and his faith was rewarded.

The two-edged sword of God's word continues as Jesus reminds his disciples that while there is no need to fear we must live in a manner appropriate for people of faith. The leap of faith may not call us to sacrifice our children but it will challenge us to show that our hearts are in the right place by being prepared for the Lord's return. The example of the faithful servants who are ready for their master's return, even after a long delay, is powerfully contrasted with those who lost sight of the trust that they had been given.

Safeguarding update: URGENT!!!

If you didn't hear the message last week: we need urgently to bring our Safeguarding records up-to-date.

Thank you to the 40 volunteers who signed a Code-of-Conduct last weekend! And to all of you who are already up to date or acting to be up to date for our safeguarding needs.

I've had a couple of comments about not wanting to puff ourselves up as good people, or feeling put out because there is no trust in the world. Or that these checks are a waste of time as they are reactive.

These checks are not about that at all. For a start they are confidential: you are known to be compliant by the fact of being a volunteer. These checks are about making a statement and taking action to keep safeguarding of children. And indeed all people, in our minds as a conscious behaviour, maintaining an appropriate awareness of keeping an eye out for things that might put our children at risk. Please do comply, it is a small thing.

There are two things we need to do:

- Sign the Code-of-Conduct again: it's been three years and a renewal is mandated.
- Check your Working With Children Check (WWCC):
 - Is it still current? If yes, do you have St Gregory's Parish included as your volunteer organisation (with the St Gregory's Church not school address). Include the school if you also volunteer there.
 - No? Not current? Please get it renewed ASAP and ensure St Greg's is
 - Please don't volunteer untill you have got the renewal process underway – and please let us know you are applying.
 - If you are a volunteer and don't have a WWCC, please put in an application for a WWCC as soon as possible, including St Gregory's as a volunteer organisation. Include the school if you also volunteer there. Please don't volunteer until your application is underway (and let us know you have applied).

Volunteers are all people who help around the church on a regular or semiregular or casual basis. This includes everyone over 18 years old. The net is cast wide by Government and by the Archdiocese so if in doubt please get a check.

WWCC's are free for volunteers and your photo can be taken using your phone or computer's camera.

We can help at the office if needed: please call or drop in.
