BREAKING OPEN THE WORD

INCLUSIVE LOVE

How should we deal with the hurts that we receive? Should we respond by retaliating? Is there any future in the way of peace and forgiveness? These questions are as pressing today as they were in the ancient world. The people of Israel based their behaviour on the nature of the living God. As God is holy, so Israel was to express its holiness by forbearance and forgiveness among its members. Members of the people of Israel were called to love one another and forego the duty of vengeance when it came to other covenant members.

Jesus took this even further and extended it beyond Israel into our relationship with all people. Now even enemies are to be treated as brothers and sisters. Jesus knew that it is by forgiving that we can share in the nature of the living God and so become complete. It is by our preparedness to forgive that we share in the even-handed perfection of God whose love is poured out for all, deserving or not.

Perhaps Paul was mindful of Jesus' words that a house divided against itself cannot stand (cf. Mark 3:25) when he reminded the Corinthians that they were the Temple of God. Since each member shared in the gift of the Spirit there was no place for division or competition. Paul, Apollos and Cephas were united in their ministry as servants of the Gospel. If they were united, why was the community divided? It was now time to turn the other cheek and live in unity and peace.

From the PP:

Graffiti! We have a problem I'd like your help with.

We have been getting an increasing amount of graffiti principally affecting our pews on the East side of the church. And it is that is beginning to degrade our pews. And the graffiti has been getting degrading our pews. I hesitate to say there is a trend but just this week one strong swear word was drawn on a pew. The parishioner who found this graffiti was shocked that such a thing would be done within our church.

If you see someone scratching into the pews—ask them to stop if you are comfortable to so otherwise report the event. If it's your child: please bring along more resources to help them stay focussed during Mass: we want you here, we want your children here. I can help you find materials that can help you help them learn to stay sensible and focussed as they learn about and get drawn into the wonder and glory that lies within what is admittedly a complex celebration of Word and Eucharist.

Slightly different damage to pews: Chewing Gum: Please dispose of your chewing gum into the bin outside the church before you come in to the church—please don't stick it on the underneath of pews. It is both unhygienic and totally disgusting.

The consequences of this graffiti: we will need to spend several thousand dollars to remove the graffiti and repair the pews.

When you 'give out communion' you are not giving out communion you are helping the people around you to receive Jesus Christ himself into their lives, their bodies, the depths of their very selves.

Please make sure you come along to one of the sessions. It is vital that we form ourselves for these ministries so that we can know Christ more fully.

Call for members: we need more people to step in and help us function fully and effectively: computer operators (6 pm Sat / 5 pm Sun), sacristans, lectors, ministers assisting at holy communion, ministers visiting the sick/homebound, social committee, young adults, youth group, children's liturgy, RCIA group leadership, Parish Pastoral Council etc. etc. Please look into your heart: what are you called to do or do more to help us be the presence of Christ for the parish of St Gregory's.
