BREAKING OPEN THE WORD

MARY, MOTHER OF GOD

The Octave of Christmas concludes by honouring Mary as the Mother of God continuing the long and rich tradition that goes back to the Council of Ephesus in 431. The formula that Levites and priests were instructed to use when blessing the people of Israel has a special resonance when applied to Mary. She could surely say that she had been blessed in the gift of Jesus, that God's face had shone upon her, and that God had been gracious to her in ways that she could never have anticipated or imagined. Her positive response to the words of the angel Gabriel opened a pathway for all humanity.

In the letter to the Galatians, we get a glimpse into Paul's wonder at the mysterious ways of God knowing that our ability to cry out in the Spirit 'Abba, Father' would not have come about if Jesus had not been born of Mary. He describes this birth as taking place in the fullness of God's time. Jesus was born as a member of the people of Israel, but this is only a part of his identity and role in God's saving plan that extends to all creation.

The first witnesses to the birth of Jesus in Luke's Gospel were the shepherds who were informed that a Saviour had been born in Bethlehem, the city of David whose own career as king started humbly as a shepherd. In a similar way, Jesus' humble beginnings in a manger will lead to blessings for all of us. Like Mary, we are called to treasure all this in our hearts.

Thoughts from the PP:

Last weekend my surprise testing positive for Covid-19 prevented me participating in our Christmas Masses, though I felt almost present for the four St Greg's Masses as I sat in my lounge and listed to the singing for Carols and for Mass: clearly audible from next door. Almost present! But isolated.

I know from reports that we had about 400/150/150/350 people present across the Masses: over a thousand people singing and praying to the glory of God among us. Thank you for joining together so joyfully to affirm our faith.

It was most moving, I cried, when Margaret sent me a video of the singing of the final hymn from the 10:30 am Mass on Sunday/Christmas morning. Such a wonderful thought and action. Thank you. Thank you all.

And thank you greatly to everyone who helped make our Christmas gatherings a success. Mary and Margaret and Mo and Gavin and other singers and Bishop Les of course, and Joan and Peter and all the lectors and communion ministers and collectors and Ray and James and ...



Recognise this young man? Sadly, he's finished his stay with us.

One consequence of my being in isolation was that I could not publicly give a blessing and say 'goodbye' to Jude as he concluded his pastoral placement with us. I think you would agree that he has been a great grace and joy for us as he used this year to grow in understanding of parish life. As Jude finished packing

and loading his car last Sunday and then came back inside, he came to me for a blessing. Of course I gave him God's blessing from all of us. A blessing of thanks for his presence with us and a blessing of thanks for his gift of pastoral care for so many of you, and a blessing of joy for his vocation, and a blessing of hope asking that he will allow the Holy Spirit to live within his heart as strongly tomorrow as it does today. Please keep him in your prayers.

Today, with the New Year we celebrate the Feast of Mary the Holy Mother of God. This feast brings home again the truth that God has come among us. Mary did not come before God, of course. But she was the essential human element of God coming to be with us (always, in all times and places). Without Mary's acceptance of being Mother humanity, you and I, would be completely cut off from knowing and sharing in God's love.

As we move into this new year of 2023, let us frame any New Year's resolutions around God's love and how we can share that love. My experience of New Year's resolutions that focus on me is that they last until January 2nd at best. Certainly it is laudable to seek to lose weight or work fewer hours or pray more and so on. Absolutely laudable. But when it focusses on ME, I fail. Far more successful is looking beyond myself: prepare and deliver more insightful homilies so that you can more deeply see God's love: that means I pray more and because I am focussed on something good I want to do I eat less.
