Gospel: Matthew 10:37-42

Jesus instructed the Twelve as follows: ‘Anyone who prefers father or mother to me is not worthy of me. Anyone who prefers son or daughter to me is not worthy of me. Anyone who does not take his cross and following my footsteps is not worthy of me. Anyone who finds his life will lose it; anyone who loses his life for my sake will find it.

‘Anyone who welcomes you welcomes me; and those who welcome me welcome the one who sent me.

‘Anyone who welcomes a prophet because he is a prophet will have a prophet’s reward; and anyone who welcomes a holy man because he is a holy man will have a holy man’s reward.

‘If anyone gives so much as a cup of cold water to one of these little ones because he is a disciple, then I tell you solemnly, he will most certainly not lose his reward.’



Reflection:

Jesus’ missionary instructions to the Twelve take up the whole of chapter ten in Matthew’s gospel. Today we hear the final section of his discourse. It falls into two parts. The first half is directed at the apostles themselves, the second at those to whom they are sent.

Jesus makes no bones about the cost of discipleship. It must take priority over all family ties; it is inescapably a way of the cross (this being the first mention of the cross in Matthew); and it demands abandoning the human instinct of self-preservation. The paradoxical result will be the discovery of true life.

For those who welcome a disciple of Jesus, whether as a prophet or holy one or a little one, there is a corresponding reward. Those who are sent are emissaries of Jesus himself, just as Jesus was sent by God. All this implies a new kind of family, not based on human ties, but on God’s embrace of Jesus, the disciples and those who welcome them.

The reading thus consists of a series of sayings strung together like prayer beads. Each one offers food for thought and should be given due weight and time in the proclamation.

What is RCIA? The RCIA, which stands for **Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults**, is a process through which non-baptised men and women enter the Catholic Church. It includes several stages marked by study, prayer and rites at Mass. Participants in the RCIA are known as catechumens - and it’s a wonderful adult journey of Christian discovery and personal renewal.

FIRST DAY OF NAIDOC WEEK TIMELINE

1920s

Aboriginal Rights Groups Boycott Australia Day

Aboriginal rights groups decided not to participate in Australia Day celebrations due to the poor status and treatment that was experienced by Indigenous people.

January 26, 1928

Day of Mourning Commemorated

The Aborigines Progressive Association held a major civil rights gathering that protested the poor treatment of the Indigenous people.

1955

Aborigines Day Incepted

Instead of protests, Aborigines Day began to celebrate the Aboriginal and Islander people of Australia.

1972

Department of Aboriginal Affairs Formed

The group came together to advocate for Australia's native people.

1990s

NAIDOC Week Get its Name

Although the acronyms have changed a couple of times, NAIDOC became the official title of the weeklong celebration in July.

Liturgy of the Word with Communion


