June: The Month of the Most Sacred Heart of Jesus

When God the Son took to Himself a human nature in the womb of Our Lady, He took to Himself a human heart. As God Christ's love is infinite, but as man it is the love of a brother and friend.



The feast of the Most Sacred Heart of Jesus was first celebrated liturgically in 1675 following the apparitions of our Lord to St Margaret Mary Alacoque. In these visions our Lord said to her, "Behold the Heart which has so loved men that it has spared nothing, even to exhausting and consuming Itself, in order to testify Its love; and in return, I receive from the greater part only ingratitude, by their irreverence and sacrilege, and by the coldness and contempt they have for Me in this Sacrament of Love (i.e. the Eucharist)."

Devotion to the Sacred Heart unites thanksgiving and reparation in the charity of Christ. A spirit of reparation is not to be confused with a spirit of bitterness or gloominess; rather it is a spirit of love. St John writes, "God's love was revealed among us in this way: God sent His only Son into the world so that we might live through Him" (1 John 4:9). We live through Him if we love like Him. We can love like Jesus Christ only by keeping our souls in the state of grace: "Sanctifying grace is an habitual gift, a stable and supernatural disposition that perfects the soul itself to enable it to live with God, to act by his love" (Catechism of the Catholic Church (CCC), n. 2000).

Grace is the life of our soul, because the life of our soul is the love of God. We receive sanctifying grace in Baptism and it is restored to us in the Sacrament of Penance, if we lose it by deliberate mortal sin (CCC 1861). Grace enables us to perform all our actions in union with the love of Christ. It elevates our nature, work, study, family life, sufferings and recreations into a participation in the life of God who is Love Himself.

Our Lord showed the fullness of His love by His passion and death for, "no one has greater love than this, to lay down one's life" (John 15:13). This one perfect sacrifice of infinite love is renewed for us each day in the Holy Eucharist. Devotion to the Sacred Heart is made concrete in our lives by devotion to the Eucharist where Christ is contained, offered to God and received by us. This why Jesus asked St Margaret Mary for the first Friday devotion where people are invited to make a good confession, receive communion well in a spirit of reparation and offer an act of atonement.

The Prayer over the Offerings in the Mass of the Sacred Heart says, "Look, O Lord, we pray, on the surpassing charity in the Heart of your beloved Son, that what we offer may be a gift acceptable to you and an expiation of our offences." During the month of June, we should make this prayer our own, living always in the state of grace and uniting our whole life to the Holy Eucharist. To be united to the Eucharist is to be united to the love of the Heart of Jesus Christ.
