A reading from the Acts of the Apostles Acts 5: 27-32, 40-41

The high priest demanded an explanation of the apostles, 'We gave you a formal warning,' he said 'not to preach in this name, and what have you done? You have filled Jerusalem with your teaching, and seem determined to fix the guilt of this man's death on us.' In reply Peter and the apostles said, 'Obedience to God comes before obedience to men: it was the God of our ancestors who raised up Jesus, but it was you who had him executed by hanging on a tree. And so they left the presence of the Sanhedrin glad to have had the honour of suffering humiliation for the sake of the name.

GOSPEL

A reading from the holy Gospel according to John 20:19-31

Jesus showed himself again to the disciples. It was by the Sea of Tiberias, and it happened like this: Simon Peter, Thomas called the twin, Nathanael from Cana in Galilee, the sons of Zebedee and two more of his disciples were together. Simon Peter said, 'I'm going fishing.' They replied, 'We'll come with you.' They went out and got into the boat but caught nothing that night. It was light by now and there stood Jesus on the shore, though the disciples did not realise that it was Jesus. Jesus called out, 'Have you caught anything, friends?' And when they answered, 'No', he said, 'Throw the net out to starboard and you'll find something.' So they dropped the net, and there were so many fish that they could not haul it in. The disciple Jesus loved said to Peter, 'It is the Lord,' At these words 'It is the Lord', Simon Peter, who had practically nothing on, wrapped his cloak round him and jumped into the water. The other disciples came on in the boat, towing the net and the fish; they were only about a hundred yards from land. As soon as they came ashore they saw that there was some bread there, and a charcoal fire with fish cooking on it. Jesus said, 'Bring some of the fish you have just caught,' Simon Peter went aboard and dragged the net to the shore, full of big fish, one hundred and fifty-three of them; and in spite of there being so many the net was not broken. Jesus said to them, 'Come and have breakfast.' None of the disciples was bold enough to ask, 'Who are you?'; they knew quite well it was the Lord. Jesus then stepped forward, took the bread and gave it to them, and the same with the fish. This was the third time that Jesus showed himself to the disciples after rising from the dead. After the meal Jesus said to Simon Peter, 'Simon son of John, do you love me more than these others do?' He answered, 'Yes Lord, you know I love you.' Jesus said to him, 'Feed my lambs.' A second time he said to him. 'Simon son of John, do you love me?' He replied, 'Yes, Lord, you know I love you.' Jesus said to him, 'Look after my sheep.' Then he said to him a third time, 'Simon son of John, do you love me?' Peter was upset that he asked him the third time, 'Do you love me?' and said, 'Lord, you know everything; you know

FOCUS ON THE WORD...

Three times Peter is asked if he loves Jesus. Perhaps Jesus is referring Peter back to his bitter shame, when he denied Jesus three times. Jesus is saying, just checking, just making sure! If you are going to be leader of the flock then much is demanded. Peter is a role model, he denied Jesus, but his joy at seeing Jesus sees him jump into the water in today's Gospel. It shows him filled with zeal, speaking about the word of God, and sharing the good news with whoever he met. Despite his obvious flaws and mistakes and failings and short comings he still follows Jesus, he still takes his lead from Christ. Christ directs his life, and in that, Peter is a role model for us flawed sinful individuals. We can feel the gaze of Jesus upon us and his words do you love me? Are you sure, just checking, because you are not always showing it.

There are times in our lives when the darkness of sin or selfishness or self-pity or regret or anger or hatred or prejudice or malice surfaces in our living. There are aspects of who we are that obscure the light of Christ so that Christ has to ask us again do you love me? Easter is the miracle that enables us to examine our living in the light of Christ. Easter allows us to see how Jesus' light penetrates our being and sheds light on the darkness of our sin. The Easter season is a season for realizing that the impossible has already happened! Jesus has risen from the dead and because of that our lives are not the same anymore. The direction our lives are heading is heavenward and therefore our preoccupation is with heavenly values and cultivating them now as we live. When Jesus asks us do you love me? He is pointing us in the right direction our lives are to take. He is encouraging us to believe in him, so that his values will take deep root within us and help us on the direction towards eternity.
